The dates of my SICSA DVF were 22 June 2015 to 7 July 2015.

The main purpose of the visit was to visit Dr Ekaterina Komendantskaya (27 June to 4 July) to continue our work on coinductive logic programming. I met with her and her group in Dundee, and we worked on preparing two submissions on this topic for POPL'16. Dr Komendantskaya and I made further detailed technical plans for our continued collaboration, and looked into joint UK-US funding to support this work. I also gave a seminar entitled "Interleaving Data and Effects" on 30 June, which was followed by technical discussions on that topic both on 30 June (with seminar attendees) and on 3 July (with Dr Komendantskaya's research group).

I also visited Prof Fairouz Kammareddine of Heriot-Watt University on 24 June to discuss research topics of mutual interest (mainly term rewriting, which is related to my work with Dr Komendantskaya), and met with Dr Robert Atkey of the University of Strathclyde on 25 June to work on finishing a paper on polymorphic testing this coming autumn. In addition, I met with Federico Orsanigo, a PhD student (formerly mine) involved in my collaboration with researchers (Ghani, Nordvall-Forsberg, Orsanigo, and Revell) at the University of Strathclyde on 4 July.

He and I discussed future research plans, as well as the MFPS conference talk he had just given on the most recent results of our collaboration. Finally, I met with Dr Fredrik Nordvall-Forsberg on 5 July to make detailed plans for our (Ghani, Nordvall-Forsberg, Orsanigo) continued research collaboration on bifibrational parametricity. This research is supported by EPSRC.

All in all, it was a very productive visit, and I believe it has greatly furthered my collaborations with my Scottish research colleagues, and will also lead to enhanced collaborations amongst them. Many thanks for making it possible!
